Friendship Pads are located in the pews. Please take the time to fill out them out. The information you provide helps us with attendance and to follow up with visitors to Salem.



Prayer Requests can be written on the prayer cards located in the lobby. Place it in the prayer quilt that is in the lobby near the sanctuary entrance.

Going Deeper in "That's Amazing"

Read the following a few times:

John 2:1-11; Luke 3:21-22; Mark 2:22; Eph 5:32; Joel 3:18
 Jesus begins his mission at a wedding feast. The host family hadn't planned very well, so Mary turned to Jesus for help.

Reflect on the following:

1. When have you been to a wedding ceremony or celebration that really impressed you?
2. Does what you consider to be amazing change over time? What was amazing when you were a child?
3. During the wedding the wine ran out, which was a humiliating social situation. It would reflect badly on the host as someone too miserly to provide adequate refreshments for the guests. What is a modern equivalent that would cause a host to feel humiliation?
4. Mary plays a minor role in this Gospel, appearing only here and one other place. Her concern for the situation as well as her relationship to the servants indicates she may have played a part in the planning of the wedding that had gone terribly wrong. What wedding tragedies have you witnessed? How did they handle it?
5. How do you respond to the fact that Jesus turned water into wine? In your opinion, what is a biblical, Christ-honoring approach to the question of whether we should drink alcohol as disciples of Jesus?
6. What words you would use to describe Mary in these verses?
7. How has your walk with Jesus been going lately? Have you been praying, listen to God speak through His Word, following nudges of the Holy Spirit, and spending time worship our amazing God?

2. Ask God to you make you an amazing answer to prayer.
