Psalm 95:1-2 Jeremiah 7:23

Deuteronomy invites its readers to imagine what it would have been like to have that insecure background and then to be in a position to bring God the fruits of this land that has indeed become theirs.

Reflect on the following:


- 1. How did your family come to the US? How did you come to the Manheim area? How did you come to Salem?
- 2. In vs 5. Moses recounts how God's people reached this point. Why do we love stories of humble beginnings? Why do we dislike people who act entitled?
- 3. What challenges have you overcome to reach this stage in your life? Who supported you along the way? How did they offer support? What was not helpful?
- 4. How do you celebrate victories in your life?
- 5. How do you celebrate the good things God has done for you and your family?
- 6. Why might God have commanded the "first of all the land's produce" as an offering? How does that principle apply to our giving today?
- 7. consider (vv. 4–10): What did the words of this ritual communicate? What did the physical actions of this ritual communicate? Why were both important?
- 8. Sometimes new arrivals will kiss the ground, as if there were some sort of personal relationship with the soil. What are some other ways new arrivals celebrate enter a new land?
- 9. What do you think is the first thing you will do when you get to heaven?

- 1. Make a list of the top 10 blessings God has given you.
- 2. Thank God for the many blessings that have marked your life's journey. Celebrate the people you met along the way who blessed your life in wonderful ways.
