Going Deeper in "Are You an Influencer?" Read the following a few times:

Matthew 5:13-16; John 12:36; Luke 14:34-35; Job 6:6 Jesus says Christians are to be like salt and light, we are to have a positive impact on the lives of those around us.

Reflect on the following:

- 1. When have you enjoyed or appreciated salt the most?
- 2. What are some of the benefits of salt that make it valuable?
- 3. How can we be salty when we're working or playing?
- 4. Who has by word and deed been an influence in your life? What was it about them that influenced your life for good?
- 5. How might we lose our influence over others?
- 6. When did you appreciate having a light the most? What did the light do that made life better for you?
- 7. Why would anyone try to hide a light? Why might we be tempted to hide the life and love of Jesus?
- 8. A trimmed wick on a candle will burn brighter and longer. What might you need to trim from your life in order to burn brighter and longer for Jesus?
- 9. Salt is a mineral not a flavor. How does salt enhance the flavor of food? How does Jesus enhance our lives?
- 10. Is your conversation seasoned with salt and light, or do you bring others down with moaning and darkness? Why do some tend to focus on the negative and ignore the positive?
- 11. How can we be the salt and light of Manheim?
- 12. Being filled with the light and love of Jesus takes time and effort. What makes it hard to find time for silence and solitude? What do you need to let go of?

Respond in one of the following ways:

- 1. The most important thing about any of us is not what we do but who we are. Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth and the light of the world." Ask God to help your influence to grow and for your light to shine brighter around you.
- To be salted with fire is to bring out what is really there. Ask God to reveal how it is with your soul and make a commitment to make it better and brighter.
