Going Deeper in "The Gift of Imperfection"

Read the following a few times:

Matt 2:1-12; Matt 6:33; Jer 29:13; Rom 12:1; Luke 9:23

Reflect on the following:

- 1. If the Wise Men showed up today, what 'treasures' might they bring for Jesus?
- 2. What kind of gift would you want to bring to Jesus and why? (It could be something meaningful, funny, creative, or even symbolic.)
- 3. What is something you believe you're gifted at or something you enjoy doing? How could you use that gift to honor God or serve others?
- 4. The wise men gave Jesus gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Why do you think they brought gifts at all? What do you think those gifts said about how they saw Jesus?
- 5. Why do you think the Wise Men were willing to travel so far just to see Jesus?
- 6. The Wise Men are outsiders, yet they show up first to worship Jesus. What does that say about who Jesus came for?
- 7. The star guided them step-by-step not all at once. How do you see God guiding you today (even if it's just one step)?
- 8. Herod saw Jesus as a threat. In what ways can Jesus feel threatening to our routines, pride, or desire for control?
- 9. How can we be more intentional about seeking Jesus—not just in church services, but in everyday life?

Wise Men Challenges — For This Week

- Seek Jesus with Intention Choose one spiritual practice to pursue daily this week. (Reading the Bible, prayer, conversation)
- 2. **Give a Costly Gift -** Do something for God or someone else that costs you something. (Time, money, comfort)
- 3. Follow God's Direction Even If It Changes Your Plans
 Identify one area where you feel God prompting a next
 step (a relationship to mend, a habit to give up, a risk to take
 for growth, a place to serve).
