Going Deeper in "We Are Family" Read the following a few times:

Matthew 8:5-13 Isaiah 2:1-5

Acts 10:38

2:1-5 Matthew 5:44 2 Peter 1:5-6

Jesus is back in his hometown, but his boyhood friends are unable to believe he is the Son of God. We find a Roman military officer is the only one who is filled with faith in who he is and what he can do.

Reflect on the following:

- 1. What obstacles hold us back from loving our neighbor as we love ourselves?
- 2. What obstacles hold us back from loving our enemies?
- 3. The Centurion humbled himself before Jesus. Why do we struggle with looking weak and demonstrating humility?
- 4. Contrast the faith of the Centurion with the faith of disciples in 8:26.
- 5. What do you think was the purpose of the healing miracles in Jesus' ministry and in the ministry of the early church?
- 6. Do you think such miracles continue today? Why or why not?
- 7. To share a meal together was a symbol of fellowship and being family. How do you picture the heavenly banquet? Who is seated around the table? How are they getting along?
- 8. The church is designed to grow and build itself up in love, as each part does its work (Eph 4:15-16). What holds us back from having this kind of love? Who are excluding from true fellowship?
- 9. Who are your enemies? What makes them enemies? Can you see any good in your enemies? Do you pray for your enemies?
- 10. Devotion to God is built upon respect, love, and desire. How much do you respect, love, and desire Jesus?

Respond in one of the following ways:

- 1. Jesus demonstrated how we are to live. It is about becoming Godly in both character and conduct; who we are and what we do. Ask Jesus to help you to become more like him, to live and love like Jesus.
- 2. Trust in the Lord Jesus for strength to live boldly for Him.
- 3. Ask God to fill you with faith like the Centurion.
- 4. Ask God for strength to share your faith openly in love.
