Read the following a few times:

Heb 13:1-7; 1 Cor 13:4-7; 1 Pet 4:8; Matt 6:19-21; Phil 4:11-13

Reflect on the following:

- 1. What does it look like to "win" at relationships in God's eyes?
- 2. How does honoring marriage (even if you're not married) reflect your values and faith?
- 3. Why is faithfulness such a crucial part of long-term relationships and friendships?
- 4. What does it mean to honor others in your words, time, and presence?
- 5. What relational habits build trust and emotional safety?
- 6. How do you recover and grow from broken relationships without becoming bitter or closed off?
- 7. Why is love of money so dangerous to our spiritual and emotional health?
- 8. What's the difference between working hard for success and becoming obsessed with wealth?
- 9. What role does gratitude play in overcoming comparison and financial stress?
- 10. In what ways does trusting God with your finances lead to peace and freedom?
- 11. How can generosity heal our relationship with money and strengthen our ties with others?

Challenges

- Spend intentional time this week praying for your spouse, future spouse, or close relationships. Ask God to help you honor those relationships with your words, actions, and choices.
- List 10 things you already have—relationships, resources, or experiences—and give thanks to God for them each day this week. Refuse to complain or compare.
- **3.** Choose one thing you've been tempted to buy out of desire rather than need. Instead of purchasing it, give a small gift to someone else or donate the money.
